
I'd like to end my article with words that Julia would always remind me about....."Remember, Cursillo is about making a friend, being a friend, bringing your friend to Christ".

SOME ASSEMBLY REQUIRED: THE BLUE-PRINTS OF A DIVINE MANUAL

Early at the turn of the 13th century, in a dilapidated church near Assisi, Italy, a little poor man prayed fervently, with his eyes fixed on the crucifix that hung before him. And as he did, he heard a voice that called him to "Go and rebuild my church." Little did he know at the time that he was being called to revive the fullness of Christ's Mystical Body here on earth, and not simply the place in which he prayed. Naturally, history tells us that this man, who had been called back from his involvement in the Crusades, would indeed bring life back to a dying and corrupted Church. That this "little poor man" who gave up wealth and status to follow the Lord, and much to the chagrin of the ecclesial authorities of his time, would go on to be remembered among the greatest of saints eight hundred years after his passing. He was St Francis of Assisi.

A similar story played out with God's chosen people over seventeen hundred years earlier, when King Cyrus of Persia ended the Babylonian captivity that had exiled the Israelites from their homeland. He decreed that they could go back after seventy years of being away and could again "rebuild" Jerusalem. By this time, however, there was not much to go back to, as what remained of God's Promised Land to Moses and those Israelites freed from Egypt centuries earlier had become merely a fraction of itself and a shadow of its former glory. An in-fighting among the twelve tribes of Israel had produced a divided kingdom that would lead to the siege of the Northern Kingdom by the Assyrians and the eventual evisceration of its inhabitant and their Jewish identity. To the south, the Babylonians would follow suit by expelling God's people from their home country of Judah, destroying their mighty temple, and stealing the kingdom's collective wealth. God's chosen people had 'chosen' to follow their own directives and their own impulses in turning away from Him, and clearly had only themselves to blame for all that contributed to their exile. And yet, even there, God stayed faithful.

These examples share a common theme of rebirth and restoration. St Francis, as a layman, would revitalize the Church by injecting it with the Spirit of poverty, sorely lacking in recent centuries. By his life and example, he would go on to pave the way for the religious order that shares his name and is modeled by his work. And on their part, the Israelites of the 5th and 6th centuries would go on to rebuild their shattered homeland after returning from exile. Certainly, they'd come to face other threats to their identity with the arrival of the Greeks in the years that followed, but for a time, they were able to rebuild Jerusalem, restore temple worship, and bring God back as the center of their lives. In the end, God called both St Francis and the Israelites of ancient times back to rebuild. Similarly, Christian brethren, after five years away, the Cursillo Movement of the Monterey Bay is urging the return of its Men's Weekend. An unlikely feat at present time, given the dwindling numbers of participating men in our local apostolate. To this end, dear brothers, I strongly encourage you to bring these examples cited above to prayer tonight and in the days and weeks to follow.

Some Assembly Required - continued

Let us be comforted in knowing that it is only through God's grace that the labors to which He calls us can ever produce what He wills. What He wills, He makes possible. We need only be docile enough to hear the promptings of the Holy Spirit leading us to what God calls us to do, and then having the faith and trust to let Him lead us.

For the men who have lived their Cursillo, we urge you to come back and rebuild. Before there were other three-day retreats and other church ministries competing for our attention, Eduardo Bonnin, a slave to Christ Jesus, and inspired by the Holy Spirit, gave life to a weekend encounter that shaped our views on our Risen Lord and the vital role fellowship plays in our Catholic faith. From the time we heard "De Colores" that first weekend all the way to the present day, we know how strongly the Spirit of God operates within our apostolate when it's in charge. Let it lead you, family. Let it lead you back home to Cursillo, where there is much to do and plenty to rebuild. Our sisters urge your participation at Ultrevas, School of Leaders, Secretariat, fundraisers, etc. And for those who wish to join the cause, we invite you to reach out to neighboring chapters in Fresno and San Jose and live your three-day there. We will support and facilitate your experience as best we can. And once received, please be sure to come back and help rebuild. Christ is counting on you!






God Incidents I, II, III - True Stories of God Working In the Lives of Catholics
