A WORD FROM A FELLOW CURSILLISTA

My name is Angel Gabriel Rivera, also known as "Rocky" to the Cursillo Community. I wanted to share the wonderful experience I've had working the Men's Cursillo weekends at the Diocese of San Jose.

When I first joined the team in the Diocese of San Jose, I was more than a little apprehensive, unsure, and somewhat afraid of what was going to be asked of me. I joined a group of men I didn't know (not one) to discuss my life & commitment to Christ in His community. After an evening of Meditation, Prayer, Reflection, at the beginning of the team meetings, I found myself again battling the very same feelings, desires, and challenges presented in the music I heard. At the team meetings, I was going to be asked to bear my soul and confused beliefs to my fellow brothers. As I look around the room, I noticed "the look" on the other team members' faces. The men exhibited anticipation, joy, and assurance, as they also displayed their decorated name tags; obliviously the mark of the veteran Cursillistas. I pondered; Do I open up? Do I keep silent? Do I say what they want to hear? Do I have faith? Do I expose my life with Christ? Everything that has happened at each Cursillo meeting has changed my Love for Christ forever. My experience has been more than a spiritual experience because of the close-knit family. I was accepted and welcomed as part of their family.

I have since worked five Cursillo weekends in San Jose, one every year for the last five years; as they stress, we should only work one weekend per year. As normal, every weekend has a theme. This past Men's weekend theme was "God so Loved" which included a matching song. The weekend preparation has fifteen (15) team meetings which everyone is required to attend to form Community. Prior to the Cursillo weekend, the Team meets on a Saturday called "day away", to review the entire Cursillo weekend schedule which includes the whole team hearing the Rollos. I can honestly say once the weekend starts, the Rollistas and the Service (kitchen) team have their tasks complete and ready to serve.

All five Cursillo weekends that I've worked have been spirit-filled, full of Joy, Love, and Jesus. I was on the Service (kitchen) team this past Cursillo weekend. Every mealtime had a theme which was perfectly displayed by the members of the Service team. There were also extremely powerful skits throughout the weekend! From saying the Rosary to having the Agape service, everything was a spiritual journey, from beginning to end. Christ was truly present during the Cursillo weekend.






MEN'S CURSILLO WEEKEND
